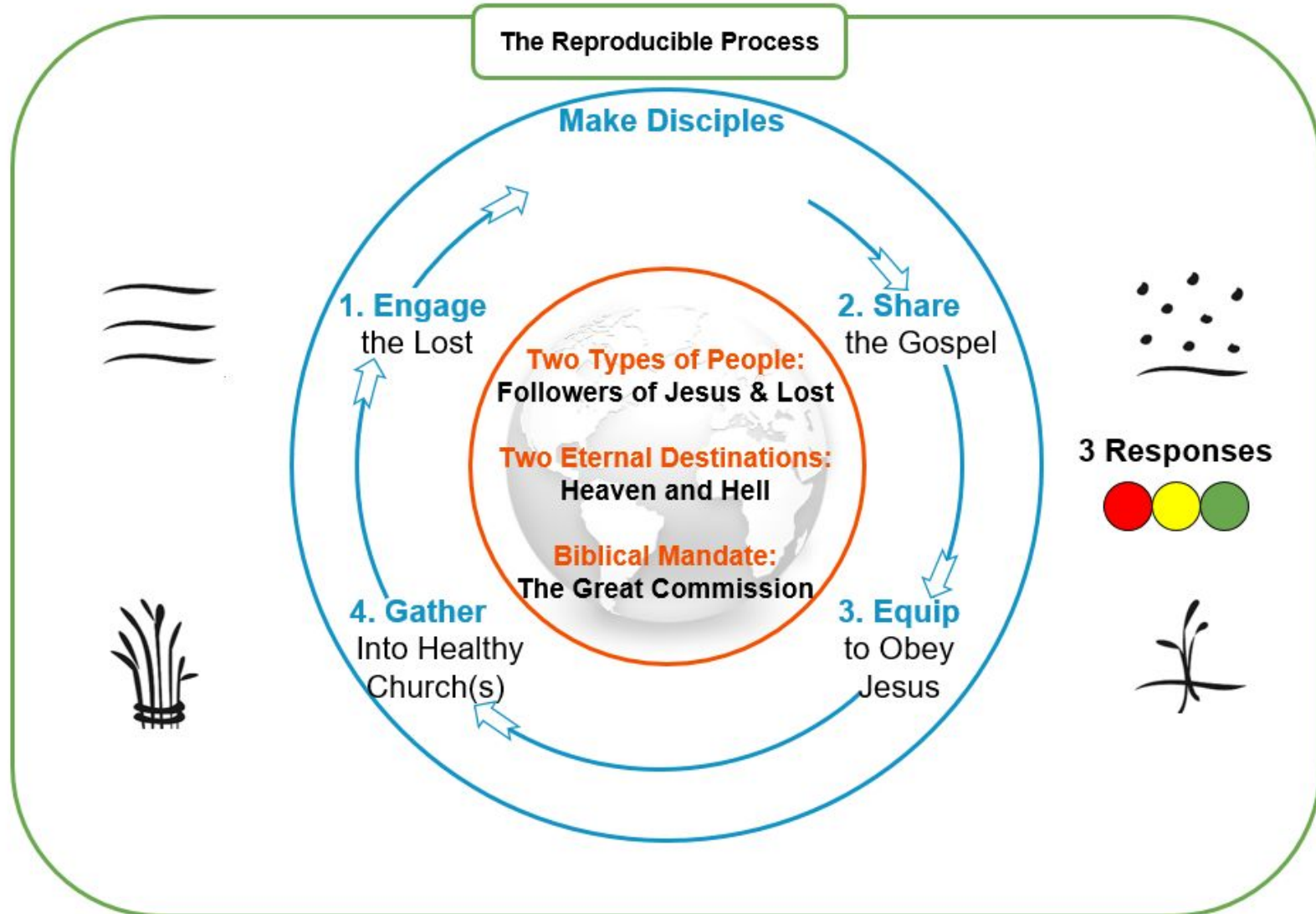


The Reproducible Process

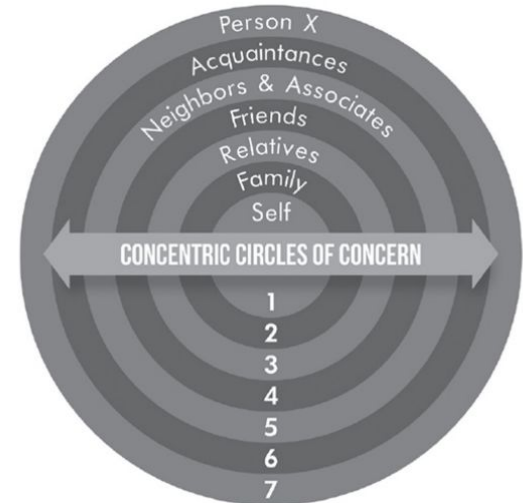
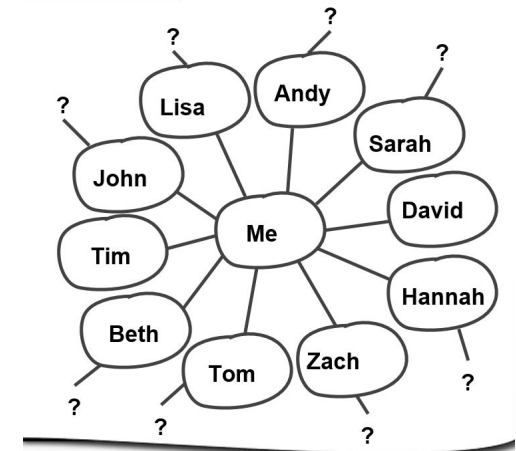


The Reproducible Process

1. Engage the Lost

- a. **Simple Tools:** Prayer Map (top right), concentric circles of concern (bottom right), having spiritual conversations, asking good questions, prayer walking, etc.
- i. **S.P.E.A.K.** method
 - 1. Story, Passions, Encouragement, Activities, Knowledge
 - ii. Asking good questions:
 - 1. What do you believe? Why do you believe it? Who has most influenced your beliefs?
 - 2. Are you a person of faith? What does that look like for you in practice?

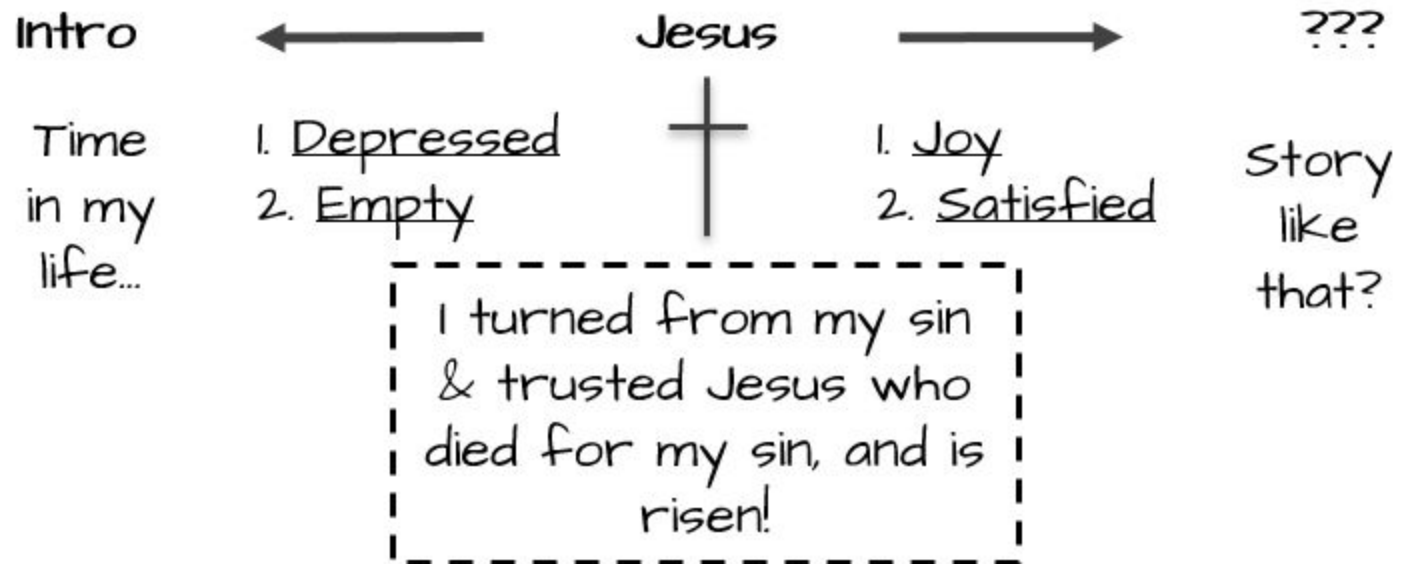
Prayer Map - John 17:20-21



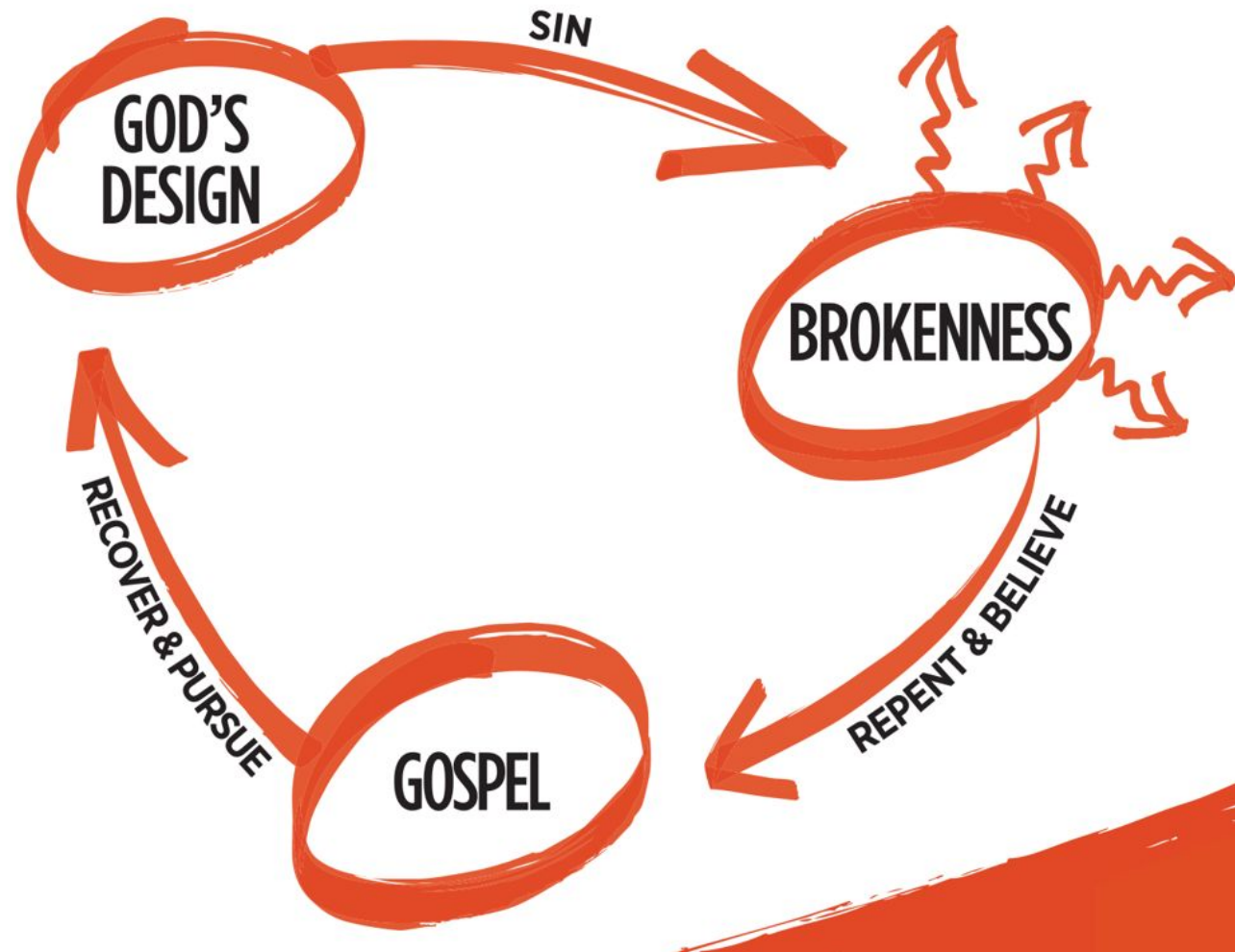
2. Share the gospel

a. **Simple Tools:** 15 Second Story and the 3 Circles gospel sharing method

- i. **Your 15 Second story** - "There was a time in my life when...", Life before Christ (two words), turning to Christ, life after Christ (two words), Ask: "Do you have a story like that?"

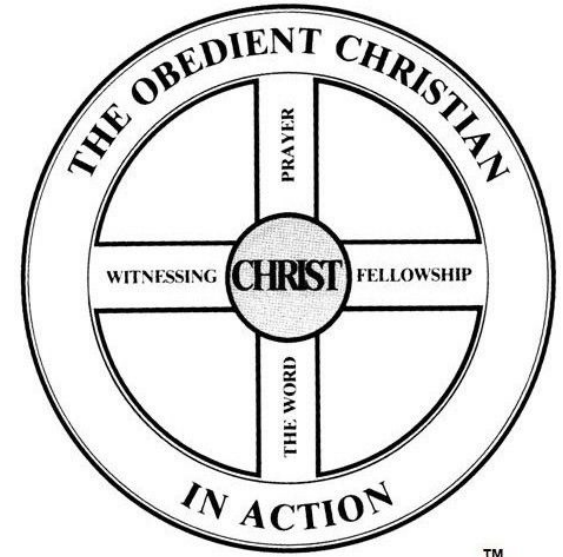


3. Equip to obey Jesus

a. **Simple Tools:** Commands of Christ (www.ObeyChrist.com), Leroy Eims' Training Objectives, Disciple-Making Essentials bookmark, Bible Study Essentials bookmark, Christian growth assessment, the Wheel

i. **Disciple-Making Essentials:**

1. How are you doing? (what's going well? What's not going well? How can I pray for you?)
2. What is God teaching you or showing you in His Word? (When do you plan to get alone with God? Do you need help with Bible reading/study?)
3. What are you going to do about what God has shown you? (What's your next step? How can I encourage you in this? How can I hold you accountable to obey Jesus?)
4. How are you doing in terms of making disciples? (How are your disciples doing? Are they making disciples? How are you doing in terms of holding them accountable?)



4. Gather into Church

a. **Simple Tools:** Be an active member of a local church and participate in the collective mission to make disciples and be a healthy church

5. Multiply leaders

a. **Simple Tools**: Look for **F.A.T.** people to **M.A.W.L.**

i. Faithful, Available, Teachable

1. Faithful - are they loyal? Trustworthy? Dependable?
2. Available - are they willing to commit to the process? Are they willing to “count the cost” of time, energy, etc.?
3. Teachable - are they willing to receive training, teaching, and rebuke (when necessary)? Do they possess an attitude of a learner?

MODEL – Jesus was constantly modeling for His disciples. Before He sent them out to preach the kingdom, heal the sick, or cast out demons they actually saw Him demonstrate these skills. (Matthew 9:35-10.9, 1 Cor. 11:1)

ASSIST – When Jesus gave His disciples a task, He would assist them. (Mark 6:35-41, 1 Thess. 3:6)

WATCH – Jesus would release authority and watch them (John 4:1-2, 2 Timothy 2:2)

LAUNCH – Jesus launched His disciples into the harvest (Matthew 10:1 – 11:1) and ultimately He left them (Acts 1:7-11) but not without giving them the help and comfort of the Holy Spirit (Acts 2:1-4). The Apostle Paul models this as well when he addresses the elders in Ephesus and leaves them in charge of the ministry. (Acts 20:18-28)

MAWL Method Applied

- **I do. You watch. We talk.** (Model)
- **I do. You help. We talk.** (Model)
- **You do. I help. We talk.** (Assist)
- **You do. I watch. We talk.** (Watch)
- **You do. Someone else watches. We talk.** (Launch)
